## Healthy Homes Initiative Five-year outcomes evaluation

We are thrilled to be able to share the latest report from the Healthy Homes initiative. The report includes a five-year outcomes evaluation conducted by the evaluation team at He Kainga Oranga (University of Otago—Wellington), led by Professor Nevil Pierse. The report was released on 29 November 2024 by the Hon Dr Shane Reti and highlights the significant impact the HHI has had for over 200,000 referred whānau members including children, leading to fewer hospital visits and trips to the GP. #### Some key findings

Five years after the HHI intervention, participants experienced significant health and social benefits, for example:

A. a 18.6% decrease in all-cause hospitalisations per person (or 10,354 averted hospitalisations per year across 186,016 people).

B. a 5% reduction in school absence for illness for children (with 5,309 more days in school per year across 57,626 children).

C. a slight but persistent increase in wages and less need for benefits for adults.
